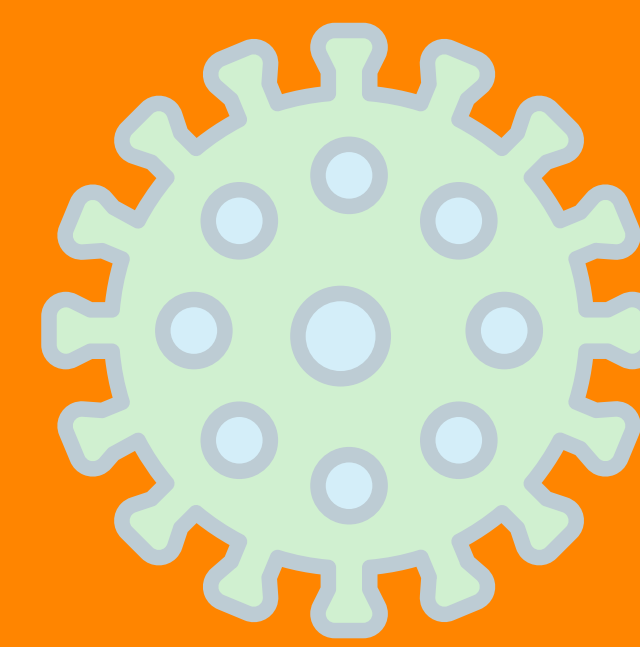
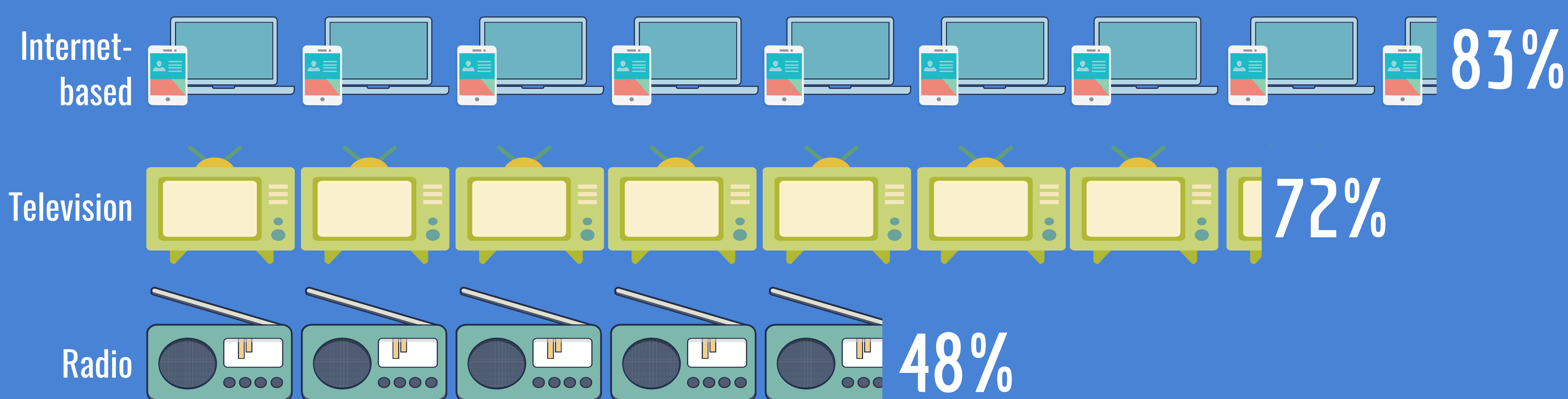


REMOTE LEARNING DURING COVID-19

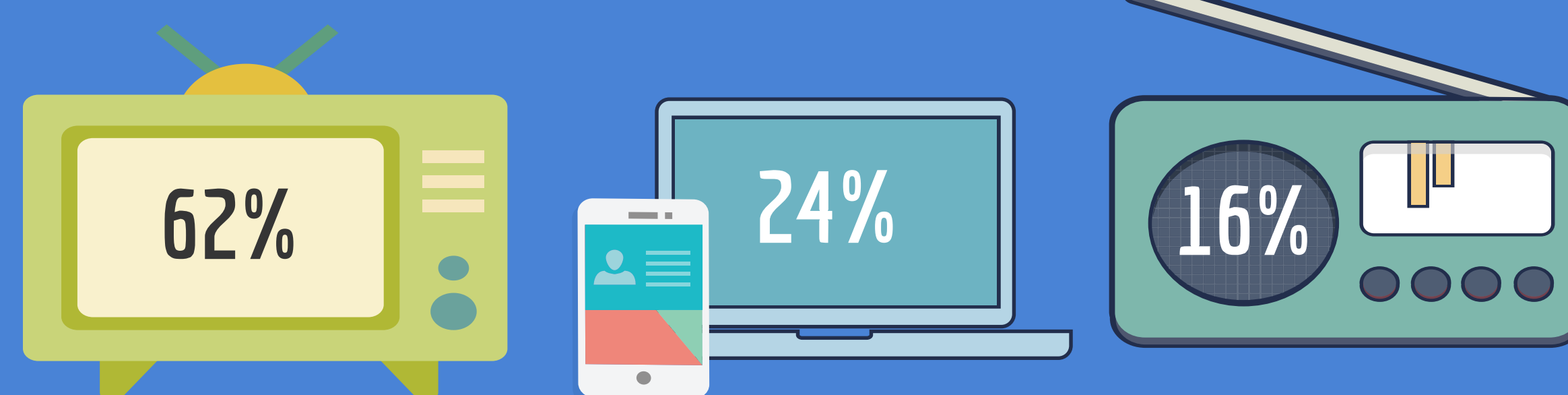


To assess student access to remote learning during school closures due to COVID-19, UNICEF collected data about broadcast (television and radio) and digital (internet-based) instruction policies from more than 100 ministries of education around the world. Here are some of the findings.

94% of countries offered at least one of the three forms of instruction below, with digital (internet-based) instruction the most common approach



However, globally, television-based policies had the potential to reach the highest proportion of students



As such, UNICEF says at least 463 million students around the world cannot be reached by digital and broadcast remote learning policies
