

Teachers who work second jobs



The National Center for Educational Statistics has released a new paper exploring national data* on US public school teachers who work a second job, outside the education system. This infographic takes a look at some of the findings, all relating to the 2017-18 school year.



18% of full-time US public school teachers supplemented their base salary with a second job

Arts or music teachers had the highest rate of taking on outside jobs

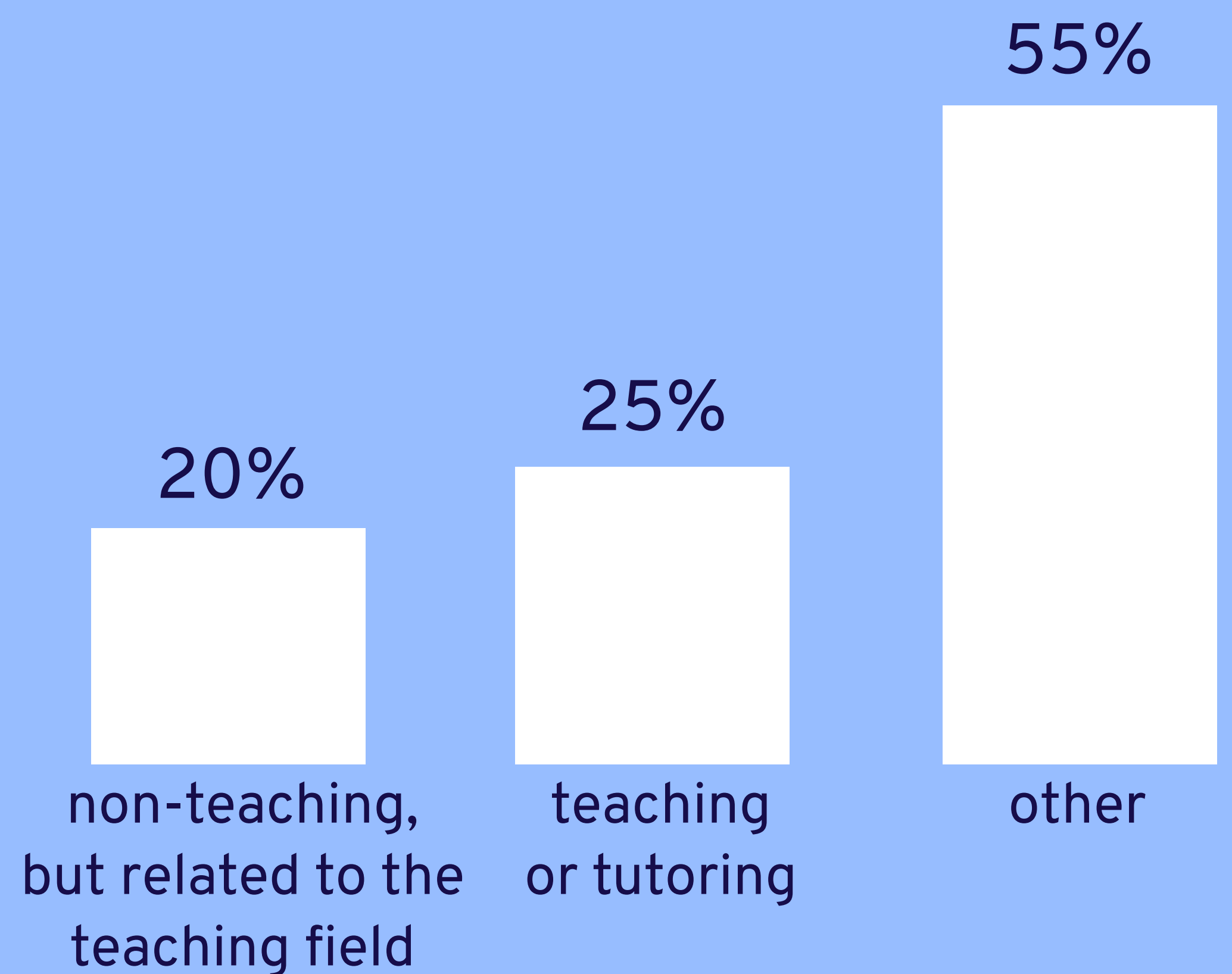


Early childhood or general elementary teachers had the lowest rate
