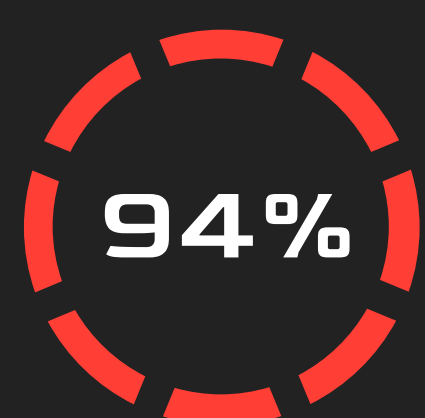


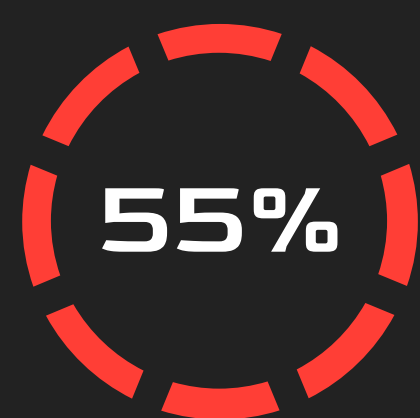

What do teachers think about financial education?

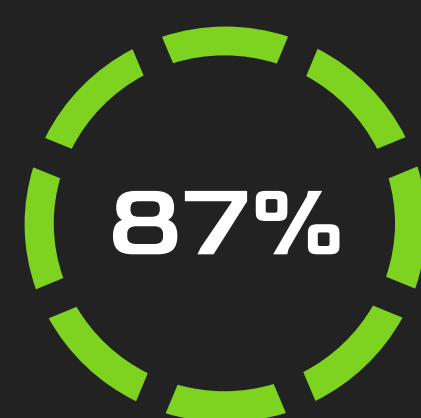


agree it's important for children to learn about money and finance

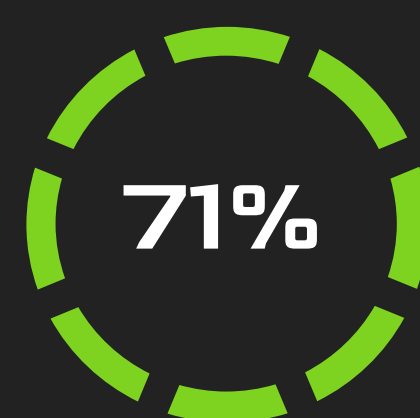


believe it's even more important given the COVID pandemic

What do teachers think would make financial education more effective?



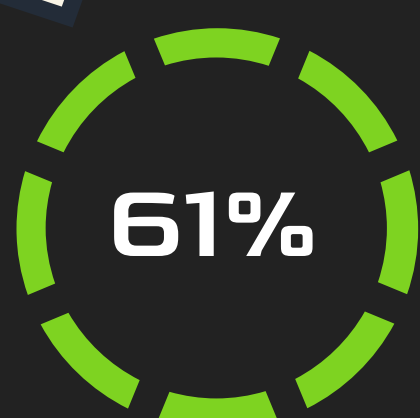

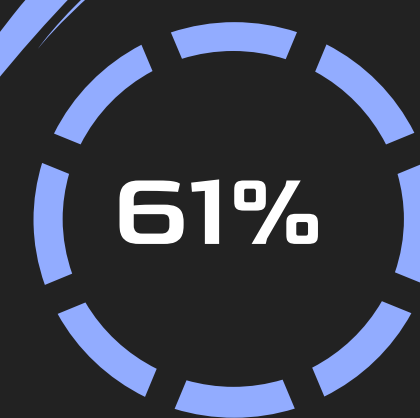
Classroom activities linked to curriculum

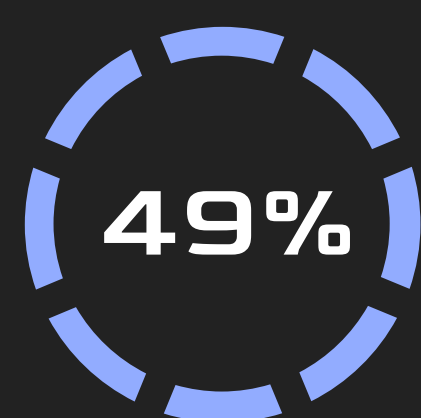

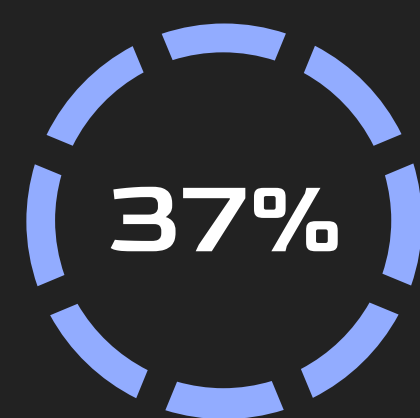

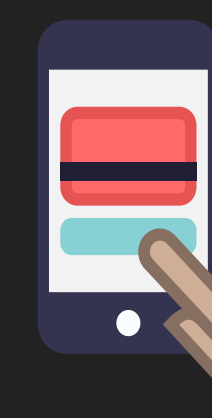

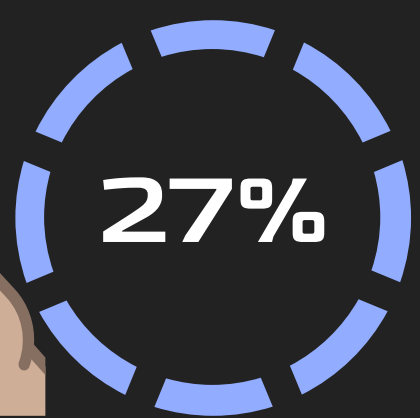
