'Work with co-workers! **Share the planning** and teaching load. Do not try to do it all on your own!'

'**Plan your week.** Plan your lessons well, plan when you are going to complete professional tasks...'

'Always be flexible with your planning... Follow your plan, do your best teaching, but **if something doesn't go to plan**, reflect on it and learn from it.'

'Have a teacher planner and **use it daily** (at least school days) ... It gives you a great overview of how your day will pan out!'

'Rubrics can be a pain to build, but if you put the time and energy into **getting it right(ish) the first time**, it'll make marking and evidence gathering much easier.'

'Read the room! The best plans often don't work out because we have planned them for a **hypothetical class group**.'

'Be flexible – the best laid plans **can and will need to be adjusted** to fit the moment at hand.'
